YOU WILL NEED:

- Black Marker
- 1" Thick Foam Sheet
- Hot Glue Gun
- Craft Knife
- 1 Skewer
- 1 Dowel $\frac{3}{16}$ "
- Awl
- Cutter
- Poster Board
- Sandpaper
- 1 Straw $\frac{1}{4}$ "
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Cardboard
- Paper
- Ruler



DIRECTIONS:




1. Using the template* cut out two kangaroo bodies, and two right and left legs from poster board.




2. Using the template* cut out one kangaroo body, one right, and one left leg from foam sheet. Lightly sand edges.



3. Glue poster board parts to the foam on both sides. Sand off any rough edges of the foam if needed.



4. With an awl, make a puncture in the body where indicated on the template. Expand the hole and insert a straw inside.



5. Cut the straw on both sides of the kangaroo's body.



6. Face the legs of the kangaroo towards each other. Make 4 punctures with the awl where indicated. Slightly expand the upper holes so the dowel will fit snugly in them.



7. Using a black marker on both the dowel and skewer, make marks at $\frac{3}{4}$ ", $2\frac{1}{4}$ ", and 3". Cut off the excess.



8. Insert the piece of dowel into the top hole on one of the kangaroo legs, up to the first mark. Insert the piece of skewer into the bottom hole.



9. Put the body of the kangaroo over the end of the dowel. The body should turn easily on the dowel. The body should move freely between the two bumps on the belly. Lift the body off the pegs and remove the pegs. Put glue in the holes. Insert the dowel and skewer back into the leg, then place the body back on.



10. Insert the other leg onto the dowel and skewer to the last mark. Check that the body moves freely, then glue. Your kangaroo can hop cautiously down an angled piece of cardboard.
